Crown: a royal symbol of power. A headpiece that Kings and Queens wear.

Begging: asking for food or money.

Recruits : military term for admitting someone into the army.

Upside down: when something is the wrong way round.

Lucky break: idiomatic expression meaning an unexpected opportunity or stroke of luck.

Only time will tell: idiomatic expression meaning the future will reveal the outcome.

Vanished: disappeared suddenly and completely.

Distinct possibility: a clear and definite chance that something might happen.

Mutual: shared by two or more parties; common to all involved.

Potpourri: a mixture of dried petals and spices placed in a bowl or small sack to perfume clothing or a room.

Renowned: known or talked about by many people; famous.

Liege: a feudal superior or sovereign.

Naive: showing a lack of experience, wisdom, or judgment.

Apprehend: to arrest someone for a crime; to understand or perceive.

Confront: to face up to and deal with a problem or difficult situation.

Petrified: so frightened that one is unable to move; terrified.

Symbol: a thing that represents or stands for something else, especially a material object representing something abstract.

Slay: to kill in a violent way; often used informally to mean to do something exceptionally well.

Mercy: compassion or forgiveness shown toward someone whom it is within one's power to punish or harm.

Terrified: extremely afraid.

Lectures: to give a long, serious talk or speech, often as a way of teaching something.

Shelter: a place giving temporary protection from bad weather or danger.
