Neutral - Unbiased or not taking sides.

Held up - Delayed or hindered.

Props - Objects used on stage by actors to enhance a performance.

Drama queen - A person who overreacts to situations, often in a theatrical or exaggerated way.

Narrator - The person who tells the story or provides commentary in a performance.

Cameo - A brief appearance by a well-known person in a film or play.

Burdening - To place a heavy load or responsibility on someone.

Bothering - Annoying or disturbing someone.

Bloody - Used as a strong adjective to express annoyance or emphasis, common in British English.

Public necessity - An essential service or item required by the general public.

Illegal - Not allowed by law.

Real estate agent - A person who helps buy, sell, or rent properties.

Catch their breath - To pause and breathe deeply after exertion or physical activity.

Flat - An apartment or a set of rooms forming an individual residence.

Time-saver - Something that reduces the amount of time needed to complete a task.

Qualifications - Skills or experience required for a job.

References - People who can vouch for a person's character or qualifications, often required when applying for a job.

Dignity - The quality of being worthy of honor or respect.

Pint - A unit of liquid measurement, commonly used for beer in the UK.

Antisocial - Avoiding or not interested in social interaction with others.

Quiz night - An event where participants answer questions to test their knowledge.

Audition - A tryout or performance given to show one's abilities, usually for a role in a play, movie, or other performance.

Headache - Pain in the head, often used metaphorically to describe a problem or annoyance.

Dramaturgical - Relating to the art or technique of writing or staging plays.



Mildly - Slightly or to a small degree.

Monologue - A long speech by one person in a play or movie, or a lengthy speech in general.

Applause - The act of clapping to show approval or enjoyment.

Blacklisted - To be excluded or shunned by a group or organisation, often as a punishment.

Pretentious - Trying to appear more important or impressive than one really is.

Scornful - Showing contempt or disdain.

Clumsy - Lacking grace or skill in movement or action, often resulting in accidents.

Intentionally - Done on purpose or deliberately.

Selfish - Concerned primarily with one's own advantage or welfare, often at the expense of others.

Irresponsible - Not showing a proper sense of responsibility.

Discreetly - In a careful and prudent manner, often to avoid drawing attention.

Self-centered - Focused solely on oneself and one's own needs or desires.

Saddle - The seat on a horse, used metaphorically to represent getting back to one's tasks or responsibilities after a failure.

La la land - A state of being out of touch with reality, often used to describe unrealistic or idealistic thinking.

Mingling - Mixing together.

Devastated - Extremely upset or shocked.

Pissed - (Informal) Annoyed or angry.

Improvised - Created or made something using whatever is available.

Tasteless - Lacking flavour or interest.

Three star chef - A highly rated chef, often referring to Michelin stars.

Curtain call - The final part of a performance where the cast comes on stage to receive applause.

KGB - The former Soviet Union's main security agency.
